## TEACHING ASSISTANTS REQUIRED FOR 2019 NLC Summer Program

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Teaching assistant duties in the NLC Summer Program include: offering tutorial sessions to assist students in developing the skills required for success in law school; working with students one-on-one to assist them in skills development and in understanding basic principles of law; assisting faculty; helping students plan social and cultural events; and some administrative duties. Evening and weekend work may be required.

Teaching assistants must be available for work from May 1<sup>st</sup> to June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Teaching assistants who elect to work for the full summer will be offered full-time employment from May 1<sup>st</sup> 2019 until August 30<sup>th</sup>. Duties before and after the NLC Summer Program will be related to Aboriginal law or legal education.

Ideally, applicants should be completing 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> year law. Applicants should have a good understanding of the function and purpose of the NLC Summer Program. Preference will be given to applicants who are program alumnus.

The salary range is approximately \$2678 per month, based on the university's student assistant pay scale, which is reviewed in the spring. Any change to the scale will be reflected in the salary paid to teaching assistants.
